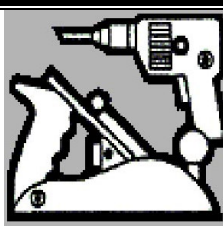

SHOW & TELL Harold Pinto showed three first class turned bowls with beautiful finish. Ray Ffrench brought along the samples of a toddler high chair and workshop stool in contrasting timbers. Ray is conducting a class on Thursday mornings from 9:00 am beginning on 9 April for members to make one or the other of these items. So far there are five members signed up.

Hubert Umlauf showed a steel cutting disc being used on a small cutting table done the same way as putting timber over the table saw. It was agreed steel cutting and timber cutting don't go together.

APRIL CLUB NIGHT Bob Morrison, the Club's turning instructor will demonstrate turning a wet wooden bowl and miniature turning. Show & Tell as usual.

THE HUGE CYPRESS PINE in the neighbouring premises has been removed. The yard is almost clear and we ask that no materials be brought along unless a committee member is asked for approval. It has been quite a job to get rid of an unwanted build-up of various timber and whatever in our limited space.

SHAVINGS AND/OR TIMBER OFF-CUTS are available for the taking, however timber from the shed is only available on a donation to the Club (preferably a gold coin).

SAFETY ON MACHINES Please speak to the duty member if you have any hesitation at all on the proper use of any machine or if unfamiliar with the use of any procedure or use of any tool or jig.

WOOD LATHES All drives, live centres are to be returned to the case provided and chisels hung back in the racks on the wall. Don't leave them lying around on lathes or benches.

CLEAN –UP Clean as you go. Sorry to keep on about these things but with 108 members (not all at once) and quite a few new members, who are not only new to the Club but also new to woodworking, it is necessary to keep the machines and floors clean as you go. A clean workshop is safer and necessary for the smooth running of the Club and for everyone's enjoyment. The Information Sheet issued with the March 2009 newsletter is a good guideline.

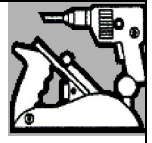
