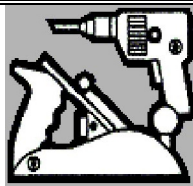

This applies to the "**Vicmarc**" lathe which has a dedicated power point- the **Vicmarc** is to be only used in this specific power point. Use in any other power point will cause power cutout.

Remember your monthly Club night – second Wednesday of the month at 7.30 pm

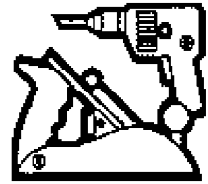
